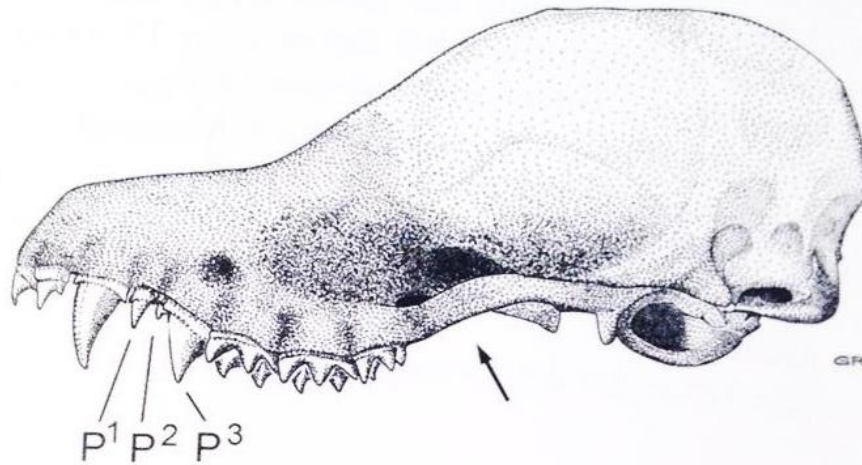

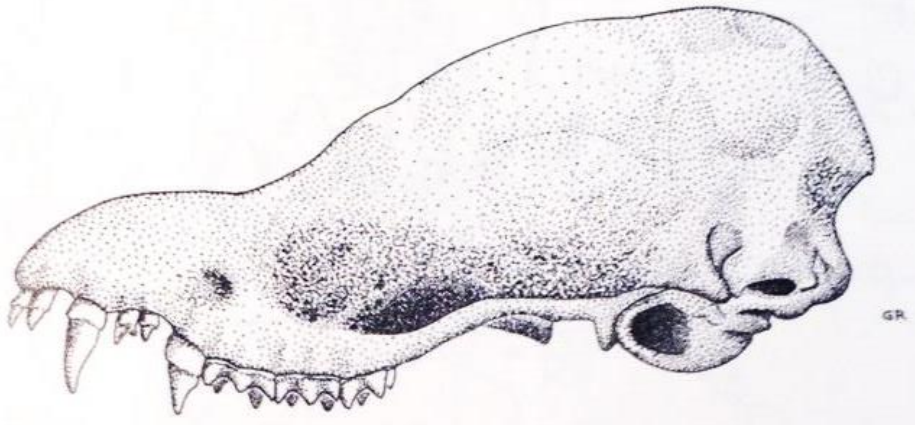

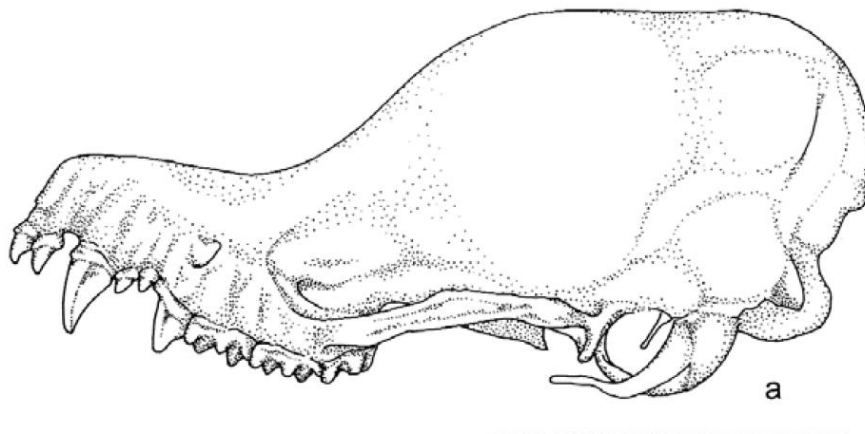

NB. It should be noted that, whilst published in 2010, the above drawings of *M mystacinus* and *M brandtii* were made from specimens collected and drawn before *M alcathoe* was first described (von Helverssen et al, 2001. Naturwissenschaften. Volume 88, Issue 5). Therefore there is some risk that these may depict this, or even another cryptic, *Myotis* bat species.
